The rules are modified for younger players to emphasise the skills of Australian football – this means fun, safe and fair games.

All our coaches are fully trained and accredited with the Australian Football League.

President's report

PRESIDENT SIMON TRACY

2018, where did you go? Seems like only last week we were at jumper presentation and preseason training was starting and Jubilee was a soft, emerald green carpet. Then all of a sudden we're collecting money for coaches and jumpers are being returned and Jubilee is a sand pit. Actually, Jubilee has been a sand pit for most of the year. At times during games it looked like a boot scoot had broken out on the far side of the ground so much dust was kicked up.

It has been an extraordinary year for the club. We continued to grow with a record 500+ players this year. This growth has come from Youth Girls teams, four of them this year, and retaining the large numbers that have been coming through from Auskick to Juniors. We had a record 67 players in U10s, the largest in any age group in Glebe's history, and U8 and U9 had 60+ players as well. We have around 190 players in Auskick, making us one of the largest Auskick centres in Sydney. I sympathise with Jubilee.

This year our committee comprised 50% women, which in 2018 isn't a big deal, but it is a new record for Glebe and reflects our passionate community.

But the most impressive stat that tell the real story of the club in 2018, you need look no further than the canteen. 10,000+ sausage and bacon and egg rolls sold. Seriously. I wonder the committee spend so much time discussing sausage girth and the controversy surrounding Schnitzel Gate.

Another new record for the Greyhounds, lost property. I recommend you and the family take the time to get a selfie at Jumper Mountain. It really is impressive. To get there just turn left at Water Bottle Graveyard and keep on going, you can't miss it. All jumpers and water bottles will be donated to charity.



The Collendina Cobras made the return trip to Glebe for State of Origin II in July. It was a great event with 80 people making the trip up the Hume Highway. On the Thursday night both teams attended the Swans vs Geelong game at the SCG and did a lap of honour to raise awareness for our charity partner, Rivers Gift, Australia's largest non Government SIDS charity. Then on Saturday we played two games of footy, the U11s won their game but the U12s went down and the Cobras retained the trophy. Both games were played in great spirit and the players did their clubs proud. Between the two clubs over \$4000 was raised for Rivers Gift, and fantastic contribution to a great charity. We'll be back in Geelong next year for Origin III and that trophy is coming back to Glebe. As well the U9s ventured to Hobart to play a game against the Sandy Bay Lions on Blundstone Arena, also in support of Rivers Gift. By all reports (the ones we can print anyway) this was also a very successful trip and both players and parents did the club proud.

The Greyhounds Beer Appreciation Night was back on a balmy April night with a wonderful selection of beers provided by club sponsor Young Henrys, as well as a live band complete with a lot of daggy dad dancing. I can't get the images from my mind. Club sponsors Eakin McCaffery Cox turned it on for us again with their networking drinks in the board room, with Merrick Watts interviewing special guest Shane Mumford. The inaugural Presidents Lunch at Glebe Point Diner welcomed past Greyhounds Presidents and Life Members together with current coaches, managers and volunteers for a great afternoon of delicious food, and entertainment courtesy of none other than Titus O'Reilly.

As well as the formal occasions the club also had plenty of informal ones, like jumper presentation when it didn't rain, Swans players visit and the U17s final game for Glebe at Jubilee. That day in particular is very special, as we fare-welled some boys who have been playing at Glebe since Auskick, and they played their last game for Glebe, on Jubilee in the black and white. Not only that but club captain Angus MacDougall celebrated his 200th game with Glebe, earning him Player Life membership. Very special indeed. Congratulations to all our departing U17s, and especially Angus on this wonderful achievement.

Then we had nine Glebe teams make finals. An incredible result. Following Gala Days, one U9 and three U10 teams went through, plus our U11-2, U12-1, U15YG and 13-3 and 15-1 Alliance teams. A great reward for a season of hard work by all involved in the teams.

From that we had two teams go onto Grand Finals, and I'm happy to say both brought home the chocolates. Congratulations to the U11-2 and the U12-1, Premiers for 2018. You'll find both teams on the wrap around cover of the year book.

Another record breaking year at the Greyhounds with 182 kids registered into Auskick, our highest ever number. Coaches were soon formulating plans to cope with the numbers, and plotting to pinch space for training on the oval. We celebrated by inflating over a hundred new balls and donning a bulk delivery of fresh wristbands. We also had 40 girls registered, way ahead of any other club in our zone, all keen to start walking the exciting pathway now there for the girls at the club, and further afield at the Swans Academy.

- **8 March:** Training began. We were fairly lucky this season and only lost a few sessions to wet weather, most groups managed to get some training in off the oval.
- **13 March:** The AFL launched Auskick officially at Birchgrove Oval.
- **5 April:** Guernsey presentation at training saw a massive turnout of kids, there can't have been many missing! We postponed from March 22 when panic spread as a few clouds wafted over the ground and we cancelled fearing a repeat of last year's drenching.
- **7 April:** Our round one matches kicked off at Maroubra, and kept kicking off thanks to dodging the rain at vital moments during the season.
- **12 April:** the boffins from the AFL came to give O Level basic training to our Auskick parents.
- **20 April:** Mike Schofield and Peter Titmuss took 30 U8s onto the SCG for half time Auskick at the Swans v Adelaide Crows game for games against Easts.

- **16 May:** Tim Schmidt from kicking Dynamics came to training and took a large group of parents through his program... they thought it was a free session, little did they know I'd have them dispensing their new found knowledge the following week!
- **2 June:** A team of U8s went to represent the club at the Pemulwuy Shield indigenous round Balmain Seniors game at Birchgrove Oval, we enjoyed a smoking ceremony, some training with the Balmain boys in a day that turned into 6 hours non stop footy for me... I'm far too old for that!
- **21 June:** Swans players Gary Rohan, Harry Cunningham and Tom McCartin visited us at training. We couldn't get on the oval, but we had a great Q & A session and all 3 Swans had developed writer's cramp after the autographs... and they still had to go to Newtown after and relive the whole experience!
- **5 July:** Mike Cooney and Dean McCartney took 30 U8s onto the SCG for half time Auskick at the Swans v Geelong game, again playing against our old foe Easts.
- **26 July:** Girls only Auskick training started and ran for 6 weeks, our friend Steph from the AFL ensured these girls will be itching to get into the game for real with us next year.
- **11 August:** Our season finished with Gala Day for U7 & U8 and final round games for U5 & U6.

Thanks to all our families that helped out on canteen, barbeque and ground set up at training and especially on the red eye shift at 7am Saturday morning. The club appreciates your efforts, and with so many new faces every week I commend the efforts of all you first timers for the work you've done, and putting up with me ordering you about. The cash we raise from all those sausage sales is vital to the club, buys our footballs, professional training and all manner of other essentials.

Thanks to all our coaches, I'd like to thank two age group coaches and managers in particular:

Jason Upcroft for taking on the Under 5s. He has done an incredibly efficient job, and can get a match report out quicker than a Fleet Street hack. He's been assisted by Mike & Rebecca Casey in training and management, keen as mustard those two are... the future of Auskick here is in very safe hands.

Also the Under 6 group had to virtually start from scratch again, and with a large group of kids, so well done to Rob Spurr and his team of coaches, and manager Melissa Rowland... no pressure, but I expect you guys to break the record for Under 7 numbers next season.

This has been my first year as coordinator, at times it is a pretty full on job, and without help it wouldn't all come together. HEAD COACH REPORT

On 12 August 2017 we thankfully farewelled Auskick. It had been a long and rewarding 4 seasons but we were done with it. So on 8 March 2018, some 208 days after our last Auskick game, 59 keen and eager U9 players arrived at Jubilee for the first training session for the 2018 season ready to lay tackles and play proper footy. Recruitment in the off-season proved successful with 15 new players turning up together with the 44 returning players.

Given such large numbers, we decided to field 4 teams, each with two coaches and two managers. Of the 45 applicants, with the assistance of Leading Teams and KPMG, we finalised the coaching pool to the top 8 applicants who were a mixture of CFO's, celebrities, lawyers, finance gurus, HR managers and of course cryptocurrency traders.

After a couple of weeks of training, we split the kids into 4 even teams and based on the results throughout the season, we got the mix 100% right. All teams won and lost games and all players made a significant contribution throughout the season. Most importantly, every single kid improved, some unrecognisable from the player who arrived at the first training session. To see their confidence grow and for each player to feel an integral part of their team was phenomenal.

It's amazing to think of where we started to where we finished the season. With so many new kids, we spent time getting their skills up to speed which did not take long. We developed team rules such as man on man defence, fast ball movement, handpass to a teammate in space, playing unselfishly, never argue with the umpire and above all else tackle, tackle, tackle. We developed defensive, midfield and forward structures and generally tried to teach the kids how to play footy. Sometimes this worked spectacularly and sometimes it failed epically.

The step up from Auskick to U9s was steep. The rules state that an U9 tackle is meant to look like a very comforting bear hug. Well 90% of the games resembled a mixture of MMA and rugby league with pretty much any type of tackle being allowed but our kids embraced this never taking a backward step.

We certainly won our fair share of games across the four teams but what I am most proud of is the way each team played the games. There was no arguing with umpires, no dirty play and no disrespecting the opposition. At times, we were faced with adversity but attacked it head on, not shying away from a particularly aggressive opponent or a decision that may have gone against us.

And of course, the highlight of the year was the 23 kids and parents who ventured down to Tasmania to play the Sandy Bay Lions. Quite simply, an unforgettable experience for all involved.

It's hard to express in words how dedicated the seven other coaches were this year. They genuinely care about the kids and the club. Every coach has a different style but each brought something to the table that the others did not have. I cannot thank them enough for their efforts. I value them as coaches but also as friends.

And finally, special thanks to Steph and the other team managers who without them, the games would not be possible. Steph has managed this group since under 5s and does it with a minimum of fuss.

COACH'S REPORT

The U11s kicked off Season 2018 with a bang having 6 weeks of Sunday pre-season fitness and skills training @ Bicentennial Park. This gave our 9 new players and returning players an opportunity to get a ball in their hand again and focus on the job ahead. In addition, we organised a pre-season

practice match with Newtown Swans, with Glebe having 28 players and Newtown 22 players in attendance. We will certainly consider this again next year.

2017 was tough, with only handful of wins chalked up collectively between the two teams for the whole season. The U11 leadership team knew we had an opportunity ahead of us to show off our preseason efforts and recruited talent, particularly as we entered divisional team layouts. We were also excited about the prospect of having a bigger field with more players on it, and the ability to sheppard. We agreed that fielding two Div 2 teams based on previous performance was the best approach.

Well, the investment the team made in themselves paid dividends in their collective performance as the season kicked off, starting with our first official training session on 8 March @ Jubilee. We were also blessed by the footy gods with limited to no wet weather impacts to Jubilee for both training and games.

Both teams were rewarded for their efforts by achieving significant wins leading into Rd7, many with the Mercy rule being applied to our opponents. It was noticeable their new found willingness to introduce more physicality into their respective games, understanding they now have a little more weight they can throw around to protect the ball and fellow players. They have become more cohesive as a team and seem to truly understand that games aren't won by individuals, it's the whole team that needs to contribute.

Thanks also the army of parents who made it possible for the boys to play, through efforts as umpires, medical support, ground managers, and supporting the all important BBQ/canteen.

COACH'S REPORT

Mongrel Ducks 2.0 La Dada Dada.

For a handful of intrepid Ducks the 2018 season started November 2017 with a lazy run and kick in the sun once a week. "What division are we in?". "How would I know? – you think they tell me anything?" Training officially starts February 2018. We are a few Ducks short of filling our 2 teams and word gets out. The allied Northern and Southern ducks are joined by an undersized flock from the West. Potentially the largest pack of Mongrels ever assembled is formed. "What division are we in?". "How would I know? – you think they tell me anything?" A couple of weeks out from the start of hostilities news from above says: 'Rob: You have Div 1, Warwick, you have Div 3.'

Rob: "Division 1?" "Of course! You won Div 2 last year – you have to go up." "Ah." The news is greeted with some trepidation. Many Ducks have never flown so high. Those that have played in Div1 some years previously recall some unflattering results. When a team came down from Div1 to play us last year, they were certainly a fearsome foe. And they had been cast out! Can a Duck fly at such heights?

You betcha. The season started with a few wins and belief and confidence grew. The Ducks rose to fly at a level that saw them competing with the best in the land. The end of the season saw the ducks soaring at number 2. All foes had been conquered and the ducks finished the regular season with 11 wins from 14 outings. Many an opposition coach was left asking "Where did these Mongrels come from?".

The successes didn't come without sacrifice. The injury toll throughout the year mounted. Playing the Div1 hardened opposition ended the season of a few Ducks early and wounded others for extended periods. Training numbers dropped as others nursed bruises and Ducks formed close relationships with physiotherapists and learnt the joys of removing strapping tape. We pushed on.

A footy season is a marathon event run over about 8 months. To win you need the talent, the team spirit, the endurance and a lot of luck. Our first Div1 run as a brace* saw us come up against the other top 4 teams in the last week of the season proper and our 2 finals matches. We were well in contention in all 3 games but although we played with passion and commitment we were overrun in the latter stages of all 3 games. By seasons end we looked tired and sore. We ran out of luck.

The Mongrel Ducks certainly now know they are capable of flying with the best. We now have the experience of what is required to match it with all in Div1 and with a bit of luck and a good illness and injury free run to allow a solid block of team training through the year, I'm sure the future will hold higher honors.

Warwick:

"Division 3? Sure." Looking at results only, you might say the season did not live up to the promise of the first two matches: a thrilling 2 point loss against Penshurst after leading most of the match, , and then an even more thrilling two point win over St. Ives when we ran over them. A cracking season was on the cards.

From there, things didn't quite pan out that way, with the other opponents in the Division coming down from Div 2. Centimetre for centimetre and kilo for kilo we were about 2/3rds the height and weight of the opposition sides, but you wouldn't know it from our endeavor or intensity. Despite being intimidated at times by bigger bodies, by season's end we were better to a man at putting our head over the ball. The pattern of our games was to take the ball from defence to attack only for an opposition tall defender to intercept and counter attack. Our forwards battled manfully week in, week out, but were usually 3 or 4 players against six.

So many games we missed out on the reward for effort. It would have meant a lot to the players to get a goal on the end of all the good work, but despite that we just plugged away and did our thing. The opposition coaches repeatedly mentioned how the game was much tougher than the scoreline suggested. A throw-away line? No. We were mercy ruled twice in the season: the first time we played Miranda and the Tigers and that never happened again. When we were level at half-time against Miranda and St. Ives late in season, they were nervous and knew they were in a scrap! And in the last round, we kept the Tigers goal-less for almost the whole second quarter, only to concede one in the last 30 seconds.

So results don't count for as much as the camaraderie, the friendships made, the effort put in, the individual and team improvement, and the respect these young men have earned from each other and their parents and fans!

Rob and Warwick:

At the time of writing we aren't sure if there is a future for the Mongrel Ducks. At this point there is no U16 comp –rumor has it there will be soon. If it's straight to U17 and it's an alliance of age groups as well as clubs the Mongrel Ducks will again morph into something new. If so, we will remember the

Duck years with great pride. Rob's proud of them as a father with a son in the group, and we're proud of them as supporters, proud they let us hang around and yell slogans at them and proud to have them as mates. We're sure all the individual ducks will have future success and are sure they have a great group of mates to "get around each other" when things don't go to plan. We're hoping for Mongrel Ducks 3.0.

COACH'S REPORT

With 3 clubs coming together (Glebe/Newtown/Moore Park) and two age groups merging the season started slowly with everyone just getting to know one another. This was compounded by the team playing in five different guernseys across the season.

Things certainly improved with a win over Willoughby/Mosman under lights at Moore Park in Rd5 and then an almost mercy rule win over Easts at Trumper in Rd7. Unfortunately, these were our only two wins of the season.

However, we can rue losses to Northern Lights (3 very close games), Easts at Jubilee was a great game of footy and a narrow loss, as was our final game at Jubilee against Willoughby Mosman, where we led at 3 quarter time, only to go down narrowly. I think for the first time being at the Div 1 level, we were competitive in most games, which shows the continuing improvement of all the players.

Certainly, with the help of Dixon Wight our under 17 Div 3 coach, we tried to implement much of the Sydney University game plan and game style, which helped us immensely defensively, but our ability to hit the corridor with our switch and 45 kicks were often let down with some basic skill errors. However, this is only setting our players up for next season and the seasons beyond and certainly for any players choosing Sydney Uni as a pathway, that transition will be much easier.
