The rules are modified for younger players to emphasise the skills of Australian football – this means fun, safe and fair games.

All our coaches are fully trained and accredited with the Australian Football League.



COACH'S REPORT

It is difficult to know where to start when trying to convey what a fantastic season the under 6s had in 2015. Week in week out we had the largest number of kids which often resulted in lending players to opposition teams or Jack running his now famous (but brutal) intra club matches pitting mate against mate. Quite a few of the under 5s from 2014 returned however there were over 25 debutants all of whom showed amazing improvement as the season progressed.

In the past where there was hesitation, he's now quickly jamming the ball on to his boot and kicking it to our forwards. Up front he's had some agonisingly close kicks at goals. He's had fun and is always fun to be around.







RIVER REID

Needing someone to demonstrate how to kick the footy at our first training session. Bing, up shot River's arm. Doink. Although her kick ricocheted off Declan's noggin, it was a great kick and certainly got everyone's attention! (Declan now sits at the back.) Game one was the half time Sydney Swans vs Freo NAB Cup game. Here, in front of all the AFL legends (Buddy, Kennedy, Fyfe) and corporate sponsors she outclassed everyone by being first to the ball and very clean with her kicks and handpasses. And this was game one! She's very competitive, dominates the midfield and is always first to volunteer. She involves everyone in the team and has encouraged all around her to improve their game. So much so, that Will Nichols has learnt to handpass. I'm sure she'll continue to shine.

TOM ROBERTS

COACH SIMON TRACY

COACH'S REPORT

The jump from Auskick to U9s is big, probably the biggest single step the players take until they move to divisions. I don't want to overstate it, in terms of life stages it's not like puberty or driving a car or starting to eat blue cheese, but in footy terms, it's pretty big. First up, they can tackle. This generally didn't seem to be a problem in the U9s, for many the willingness was there, it just required technique. Like cooking. When people start cooking that just try and jam as many flavours on a single plate as they can, and just about everything has chilli in it. The point is, like cooking, tackling requires practice, but what you lack in skill you can make up for with enthusiasm. And chilli.

The bigger field took its own toll early in the season, especially on the warm April days against the hard running sides. But we did it, we developed endurance to play out games and players got better at positioning themselves rather than just chase, chase, chase. An opposition coach from Newtown, the arch rivals of the Black team remarked after losing a game having been four goals up at half time and being held scoreless in the second half that the will and endurance of our team was so good he would be getting his players on the training track that very week.

Watching the players transition U9 rules was interesting, there were some players who I wasn't sure how they would adjust took to it naturally, they became new players on the bigger field, while some who were smashing it in the U8s took longer to get with it in U9s. I'm pleased to say that by seasons end all players in all teams were making contributions to their team's performance, and I think if you asked the coaches what they were most proud of this season, that would be it.

Natural ability will only get you so far, and as the players get older it counts for less and less, while hard work and listening to coaches becomes more important. Our natural players had great seasons, but it's the performance of the players who have to practice a bit more or be given specific instructions from coaches on what to do in the game that has been most exciting. And probably the single most important contribution to our success.

Which brings us nicely to success, a relative concept that means different things to different people. In politics, sadly it's just about winning elections. In business it's about profit and the bottom line. In Candy Crush it's about levels. Divine. In footy, it can be easy to over simplify it and say it's only about winning. At the AFL level winning is important, because success is defined in building towards a Premiership, but footy clubs at all levels play a much bigger role than just smashing out the trophies.

Success at the Glebe Greyhounds can be measured in different ways. Player registrations, volunteering, financial stability, home games at Jubilee. Getting six teams into Grand Finals, a new club record. Importantly, it's not about one single measure, it's those things together that demonstrate success. In summary, 2015 was a success for Glebe.

Then there's success U9 style. Mid way through the season we recognised our teams were unbalanced. We had lost a couple of players to the U10s and had Aiden and Arndt had season ending injuries (not football related thankfully). The coaches decided to make some changes to ensure our teams were evenly competitive, without coming at the expense of playing footy with your mates. The equalisation policy bore fruit, many of the drawn games all three of our teams were playing were coming down in our favour.

Then we played Gala Days. Put aside confusion about rules and draws and ladders and finals. What we had were three teams in a field of 22. After two weeks of round robin that group was cut to eight teams to play finals. And all three U9 teams went through, more than any other club. Our players made a very good account of themselves in their games and every single one of them should be very proud of how they played, not just on the Gala Day but for the whole season. From there the Hounds team made it all the way to the Grand Final against Easts. Unfortunately they didn't bring home the chocolates, but they didn't leave anything on the field either. I count that as success.

COACH DAN KENNY

COACH'S REPORT

Premiers Sydney Harbour U11 City Division 2

What a year! In our first year of competitive footy, the young men of the U11 Greyhounds thrived. We won the premiership, won the minor premiership, won 11 out of 13 home and away games, scored a massive 1065 points, including 163 goals, and conceded a miserly 420 points. Our percentage in the home and away season was a truly astounding 249%, an effort that would impress even Alistair Clarkson!

But the stats only tell half the story. Far more than the wins and the trophies, it was the growing maturity and determination of our players that really impressed the coaches. They brought a level of discipline and focus to training and games that we hadn't seen before, and the improvement in player skills and fitness showed that many were putting in the hours outside of training to improve their play. Most impressively, players such as Jacko and James demonstrated a reliable kick off their non-preferred side, a skill which takes many, many hours of practice, while the improvement in kicking and marking skills of some of our new guys, such as Harry and Robbo, showed that they too were working hard to be better players.

From the first game, our players lived by the mantra of playing hard and aggressive footy and moving the ball quickly. Our players showed a willingness to put their bodies on the line and take the fight to the opposition which is rarely seen in U11s footy. Samuel's efforts to single-handedly hold back the Newtown midfield in round 14 was the stand out performance, though the big bumps and heavy tackles were many and not far between. Some of the other standouts were James' big bump in the first Concord game, which really set the standard for the season, Pat's crunching shepherd to put Samuel away against Newtown, and Matthew throwing Moore Park midfielders around like they were rag dolls in the Quarter Final!

We started the season aiming to improve the speed with which we moved the ball, an objective which we definitely achieved. We moved the ball quickly and played on with confidence, ripping many an opposition apart and piling on some massive scores. This took teamwork across every part of the ground. Many a move started deep in the defence with Ben or Finn, was channelled through Baz or Jacko at half back, through Samuel and Baz in the midfield and onto Harvey, Olly or Gabriel up forward. The highlight of the year was a length of the field goal from Finn to Nick, to Will to Harvey which turned defence into six points in about 20 seconds.

Teamwork was the other area which set our team apart. This year we specialised in positions and learnt the importance of doing your job and trusting your teammate to do theirs. We saw this in the superb defensive work of Finn, Pat and Ben in the backline, the hard two-way running off halfback from Jacko and Baz, the hard grunt work from midfielders such as Samuel, James, Hayden, Matthew and Blake and the dominant forward work from Cullen, Joey or Bowie. Combined with some really strong communication and working together, particularly in defence, it made us a force to be reckoned with.

COACH'S REPORT

COACH'S REPORT

Premiers Sydney Harbour U13 Division 3

After the annus horribilis that was 2014 I was somewhat anxious as Season 2015 came into view. Not surprisingly a number of guys that played with us in 2014 didn't return. Some moved cities, some changed clubs, and some changed sports. Fortunately balancing the exodus was an influx of new or returning players.

The draw for 2015 had us playing a number of clubs we'd never encountered before; Manly, Heathcote, Ramsgate, Bangor and Willoughby Mosman. I had no idea how we'd match up against these teams but the evidence from practice matches now had my pre season anxiety in check.

The season started well with the U13s squad registering just their second victory in 20 months of football with a 39 point win! Round 6 saw the team take on Heathcote in what was to become a serious season rivalry. Despite losing Tom Greaney early in the game to a broken wrist, the boys held on for hard fought draw. Manly at Weldon Park was next. They fielded several of their Div1 players but by now the Glebe U13s were on a steady march and scored a 49 point victory. The first half of the season ended with us heading into the bye undefeated and second to Heathcote on the ladder. But yet to play a home game.

We kicked off the mid-season with very strong wins against North Ryde and Canada Bay. Around this time, sitting second and undefeated I knew we were a show for the finals. I asked the guys to consider what goals they may have for the remainder of the season. There wasn't a lot of feedback but everyone was aware there was a potential shot at a Premiership.

There always seems to be one team that troubles and for us that was Easts. Round 11 was a hotly contested game with Glebe managing to scrape a narrow 8 point win. The next week North Ryde put up a solid showing but was again dispatched by our boys in commanding style. Round 14 and Bangor were unfortunate enough to run into a full strength and tough Greyhounds outfit bristling with confidence.

In round 13 Heathcote lost their first game of the season and Glebe went to top of the table. As I pointed out to the guys – it now made us the #1 target and the challenge was retain that position through consistent performances. At that point I really felt the extra effort and momentum from all involved really begin to kick in.

In the run home to the finals Easts again provided stiff opposition. In an attempt to shore up their own finals aspirations they ran a number of their Div 1 guys against us. This was a tense and exciting game. Glebe led all game but a rally in the 3rd and 4th quarters by Easts pegged it back and on the siren Glebe prevailed by a single point. A narrow escape by the slimmest of margins but our undefeated record was intact and the Minor Premiership was in the bag.

Our last home & away game was against third placed Willoughby/Mosman who always brought out the best in Glebe. The first half was tighter than I'd have liked, however the fourth quarter was something else. In front of a vocal home crowd the boys broke loose from the midfield and piled on a burst of goals to completely blow the game open sending our opponents back over the bridge with a 40 point loss. It was a powerful display and the confidence the guys took from it was going to be needed for the finals campaign ahead.

While the Greyhounds had played some excellent football during the regular season what the guys were about to produce in the three weeks of the finals was nothing short of exhilarating. The first final was against Heathcote – a crunch game played between two opponents that had been eyeing each other off all year. This was finals footy. In front of a large crowd this was tough, contested, skilful and close. When the final siren sounded Glebe were 6 points in front eliciting cheers and whoops all round. While we took the moment to celebrate everyone knew the job wasn't done. Finishing second on the ladder gave Heathcote a second chance and I knew they would be back.

The Hawks play a tough physical brand of football and they were taking no prisoners.

At ¼ time our boys were a little rattled and it was time to compose. Message to the guys all morning was that they were good enough to win, that they deserved their place here, that their game style and effort was good enough. They just needed to lay it out, trust themselves and their teammates and let the scoreboard take care of itself. And so it did. A sense of composure began to replace the nerves and by ½ time we were a goal in front. And that's when the rain came.

As a member of the old firm and the fourth member of the all conquering midfield unit Sebastian plays a pivotal role. With Abe, Sebastian plays the opposition defence. They may be able to stop one of them but they can't stop both. Sebastian has the unique ability to simultaneously play as both an inside and an outside midfielder. This attribute allows him to slip through an oppositions midfield defence's radar and I have many recollections of Sebastian sneaking through a congested

ruck to snatch a loose possession inside only to run wide and punch it forward. Sebastian's defence is also a feature of his game and along with his midfield comrades he provides an effective and invaluable first line against the counter attack. Sebastian missed a couple of games and filling his role was one of the more demanding tasks I had to face. That in itself speaks volumes for his contribution. A contribution not lost on those observing as Sebastian always features strongly in the B&F count. Yet another outstanding year.

NAMKHAI STYLIANOU

Rounding out our new recruits for 2015 is Namkhai. Namkhai applied himself diligently to training and if it weren't for a training mishap on the eve of the Grand Final would have been the only squad member to have played every game. I recall watching Tom cover 60 meters in a flat chat sprint in the warm up game against Wests - knowing then that if we could harness that focus and effort we had a new weapon at our disposal. With Max Hochuli now permanently in the Ruck and Clem at Half back Tom was able to go forward. Using his size and agility down low, Tom played a small forwards game in the body of the biggest guy on the field. Result = carnage for the defence. Tom missed a large chunk of the early season through injury but upon returning his game went from strength to strength. Once he had ball in hand Tom was unstoppable often barnstorming toward goal literally shaking off defenders. Wet weather football is his forte and as the rain came down hard in the Grand Final we released the shackles. Tom came up the half forward line and created havoc with his size and aggression at the ball. Tom landed several massive 40+ meter goals during the season including a set shot in the rain during the final quarter of the Grand Final to sink Heathcote's aspirations. It's always exciting when Tom gets the ball and I already can't wait to see what he does in 2016.

While not his first year at Glebe we hadn't seen much of him before the season. Tom started off the year well with solid performances against Penshurst and Willoughby/Mosman.
